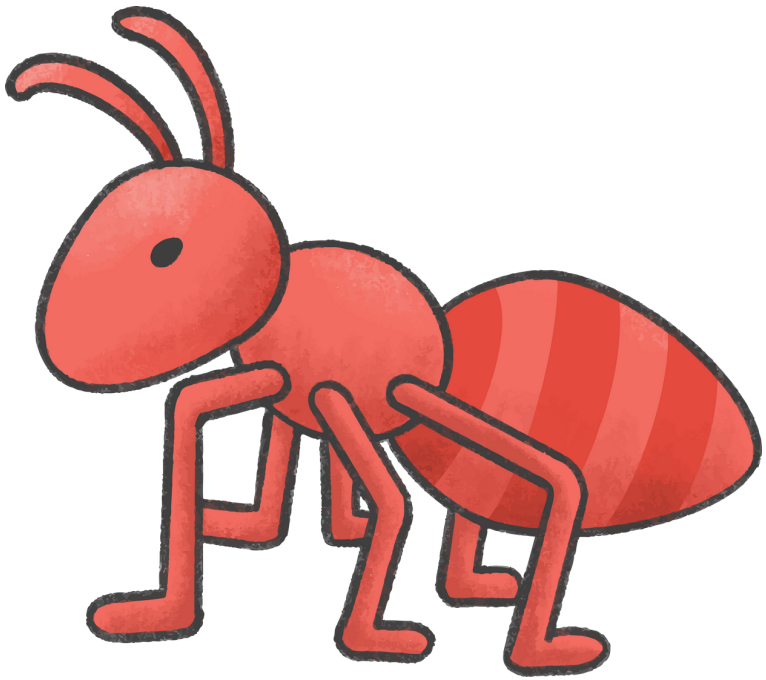

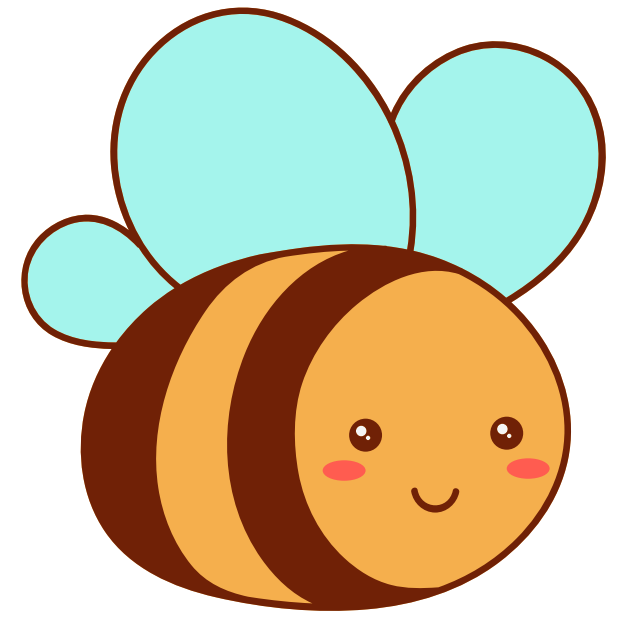
Choose **9 amazing animals**, insert an amazing image, research one fact, cut them out and use them to teach a younger class.



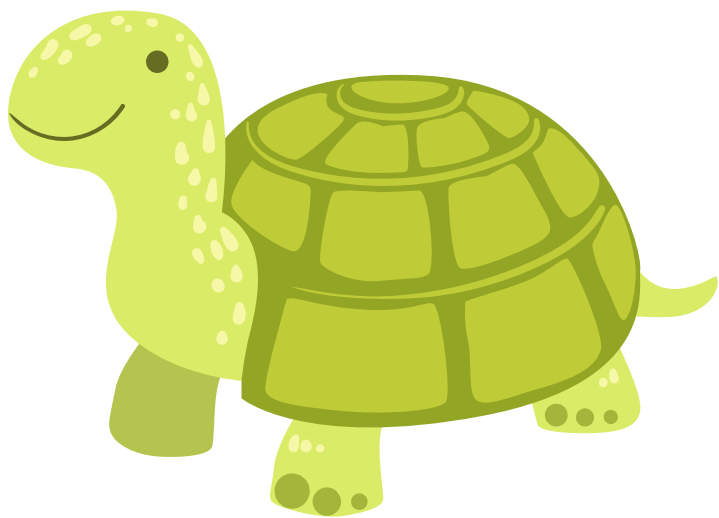
Ants can lift and carry objects up to 50 times their own body weight, showcasing remarkable strength relative to their size.



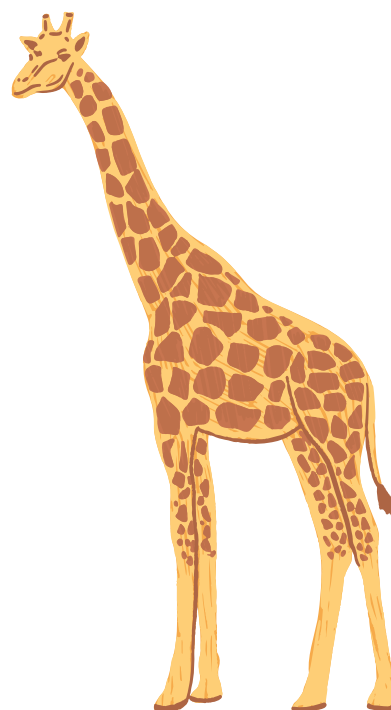
Hippos secrete a natural sunscreen, known as "blood sweat," which appears red and helps protect their skin from the sun.



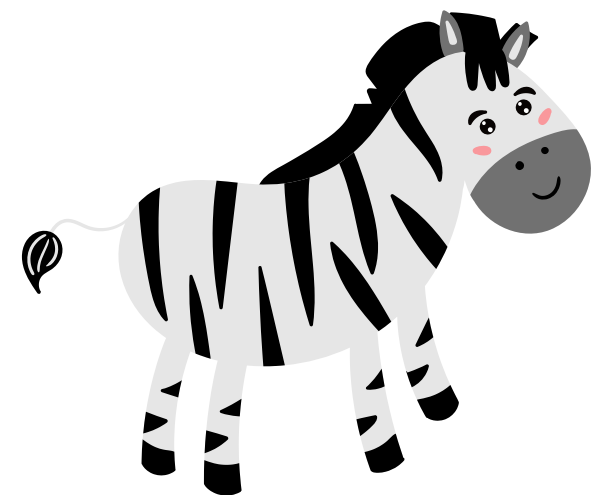
Bees have five eyes – two large compound eyes and three smaller ocelli eyes, allowing them to see ultraviolet light.



Tortoises are known for their longevity, with some species living over 150 years, making them one of the longest-living vertebrates.



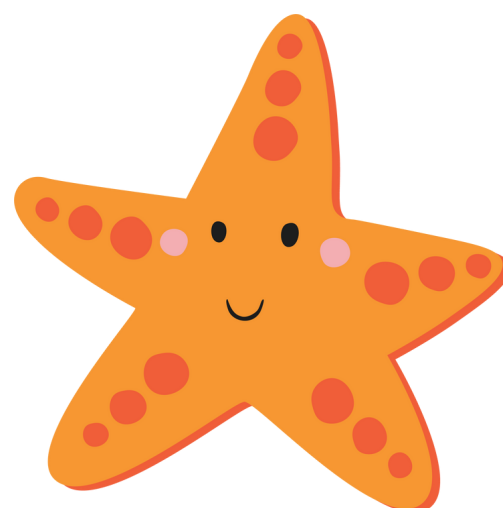
Giraffes have the same number of neck vertebrae as humans – just seven, but each one can be over 10 inches long.



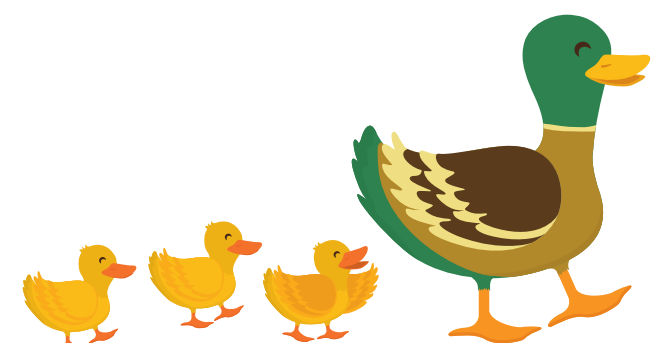
Zebras' stripes are unique to each individual, much like human fingerprints, and they may help to deter insects like biting flies.
