Project Ideas (Local - National - International)	Actions to Tackle the Issue
Local: Peer Support for Bullied Students	Organise workshops and create a buddy system to promote inclusivity.
Local: Community Garden Restoration	Coordinate clean-up days, plant new vegetation, and educate the community about the importance of green spaces.
Local: Renovation of Run-Down Playgrounds	Fundraise for materials, volunteer for labor, and partner with local businesses for support.
Local: Adoption Drives for Local Animal Shelters	Create promotional materials, host adoption events, and educate others about responsible pet ownership.
Local: Senior Companionship Programs	Set up regular visits to local retirement homes, organise social activities, and develop pen-pal exchanges.
National: Preservation of Indigenous Plants	Start a seed bank, educate others on native plants, and lobby for protective legislation.
National: National Recycling Awareness Campaign	Create informational campaigns, start a school recycling program, and advocate for local government support.
National: Support for Minority Language Education	Develop a cultural festival, create language learning resources, and petition for language classes in schools.
National: Recognition of Unsung National Heroes	Research and present about these heroes, create a dedicated website, and organise community events.
National: National Food Recovery Initiative	Develop partnerships with local businesses for food collection and distribution to those in need.
International: Global Anti-Bullying Project	Collaborate with international organisations to share resources and support global awareness.
International: Wildlife Conservation Campaign	Participate in fundraising, create educational materials, and support conservation groups.
International: Cultural Exchange and Solidarity	Establish an exchange program, fundraise for educational resources, and build a network of support.
International: Fair Trade Awareness	Host fair trade product fairs, create educational presentations, and start a fair trade club.
International: Global Food Security Education	Organise a hunger banquet, create a school garden to learn about agriculture, and engage in letter-writing campaigns to policymakers.
